


Smithson Valley High School Dual Credit Packet 2019-2020

Dear Prospective Dual Credit Student,

You have indicated a desire to enroll in a dual credit course offered at Smithson Valley High School. Be sure to carefully read all of the information that follows regarding the Dual Credit Program and the enrollment process. Please pay close attention to the required steps and due dates in this packet. Since many of these dates are set forth by the college, late forms cannot be accepted.

Dual Credit Program Information

A Dual Credit Program allows **eligible** students to earn college credit for certain high school courses in which they are enrolled. Dual credit courses are high school courses that adhere to college-level standards.

What are some positive outcomes of dual credit?

There are numerous advantages for both the student and the state in regards to dual credit. A few possible advantages include:

- > Studies show that dual credit increases the likelihood that a student will complete high school, and enroll in and persist in college.
- Decreases cost of tuition and fees for students by accelerating time to degree.
- > Contributes to the goals of closing the Gaps through greater participation and increased academic success.

The primary purpose of the Dual Credit Program is to enable students who meet the requirements to earn college credits while completing their high school education. A successfully completed dual credit course earns the student college credit which may be applied toward an associate degree and/or may transfer to other colleges and universities.

BE VERY SELECTIVE OF THE DUAL CREDIT COURSES YOU CHOOSE:

Universities' Acceptance of Dual Credit Courses

It must be noted that each college or university reserves the right to

- (1) accept college credits for transfer credit from another college or university and
- (2) apply them appropriately to a student's transcript.

It is the responsibility of the student to seek information from institutions in which he/she desires to transfer concerning the acceptance of dual credit course work and its application to a degree in the desired major.

Students are responsible for checking course compatibility when comparing DC courses from St. Philip's to other colleges/universities in Texas: www.tccns.org

Excess Semester Credit Hours (Undergraduate Funding Limit Rule)

Excess semester credit hours attempted by a resident student are not funded by the State of Texas. State law defines excess semester hours as those hours which accrue after the student "exceeds by at least 42 hours the number of semester credit hours required for the completion of the degree program in which the student is enrolled."

This includes courses attempted at other Texas public institutions. As permitted by State law, many colleges/universities will recover the lost State revenue by charging higher tuition to students exceeding the semester credit hour limit. Dual Credit classed are **exempt** from this statute.

Drop/Withdrawal from a Dual Credit Course AFTER the Withdraw Deadline

If a student withdraws from a dual credit course after the published deadline, a "W" will be placed on their college transcript. The U.S. Department of Education has requested all colleges implement a Satisfactory Academic Progress Policy in order for students to receive financial aid. St. Philip's College and many other colleges/universities policy states a student may be put on suspension from financial aid due to a low college course completion rate.

Also, an undergraduate student is permitted a total of 6 dropped courses, including any course a student has dropped at another Texas public institution of higher education. After a student has accumulated 6 dropped classes, he/she will not be permitted to drop any class unless unusual circumstances exist.

6-Drop Rule

Students are limited to a total of six (6) course drops during their undergraduate career, including a course(s) dropped at another institution as defined in Section 51.907 of the Texas Education Code. A dropped course is defined as a course in which an undergraduate student at an institution of higher education has enrolled for credit but did not complete. These are the conditions:

*the student was able to drop without receiving a grade or incurring an academic penalty;

*the student's transcript indicates or will indicate that the student was enrolled in the course past the deadline to add and drop prior to the census date; and

*the student is not dropping the course in order to withdraw from the institution.

Carefully consider the number of courses to take and the time commitment required to be successful. Students with a cumulative total of six (6) drops may not drop a course and will be awarded the grade earned at the end of the semester. A waiver may be available through the Admissions/Enrollment Services office. Contact information can be found in the left hand navigation bar under "contact information and hours."

Students should carefully consider the number of courses to take and the time commitment required to be successful. Students who have reached the six (6) drop limit and opt not to petition to excuse drops will be awarded the grade earned at the end of the semester.

Failure of Students in a Dual Credit Course

All students who are performing poorly in the dual credit course may be dropped from the college-level course within the first week or two of the semester by the published deadline to avoid future problems related to admissions, financial aid, and scholarships at institutions. Students who complete the college-level course but earn a D or an F will not be allowed to enroll in another dual credit course while in high school.

Tuition Rebates

The State of Texas offers tuition rebates to qualified resident students who complete their baccalaureate studies in a timely manner. Students must complete their program in four years and within 3 attempted credit hours of their degree plan. This includes hours taken at other institutions and dual credit courses taken during high school. If you qualify, you may be eligible for a \$1,000 tuition rebate when you graduate.

Special Note:

Comal Independent School District is authorized to provide dual credit courses for eligible high school students on the basis of an articulated agreement between CISD and Alamo Colleges/St. Philip's College. This agreement requires that participating dual credit students abide by a set of policies, procedures, and timelines put in place by Alamo Colleges/St. Philip's College. Because Comai ISD has no jurisdiction or control over SPC policies, procedures, and timelines, when an issue arises, our ability to advocate on a student's behalf is often limited. In addition, SPC prefers to resolve issues by working directly with the student involved. Therefore, while CISD is eager to assist students whenever possible, we have found that the most effective student advocate is often the student, himself.

REQUIRED DUAL CREDIT ENROLLMENT PROCESS FOR STUDENTS NEW TO DUAL CREDIT:

- 1. All students are encouraged to attend the Advanced Academics Information session/meeting on December 3rd at 6:00 pm in the SVHS Auditorium.
- 2. Complete the following IN THIS ORDER and check off as each item is completed:
 - □ SVHS New Dual Credit Student Intent to Apply/Class Choice
 - Form A (Attached) and is DUE BY December 6th to Mrs. Morrow in the Library
 - □ Apply Texas online college application for St. Philip's College
 - Instructions are attached (Form B)
 - You must include your social security number in the application in order to be issued a Banner ID from St. Philip's College. All colleges require this information, and if it is not included you will not be able to log in to your ACES account.
 - The Apply Texas application should be completed by December 19th
 - ALAMO Enroll *Please note: The college must process the Apply Texas application (usually 24-48 hours, can take up to 6 days) before a student can log in to ACES).

 - 2. Get your Alamo Colleges ACES ID and Password (Form C Attached)
 - 3. Login to ACES (Form D Attached)
 - 4. Complete the Test Prep and Go FAARR Modules (Form E):

 - 1. Students will be assigned a testing session. Sessions will be held during the school day January 22nd February 14th.
 - If your TSI test scores do not qualify you for the Dual Credit course you are interested in, you may retest once more at no cost. After the second attempt, you will be required to TSI test at St. Philip's College with St. Philip's exam charge (or another testing site of your choice).
 - 3. Students can study for the TSI test using the following:
 - Download the Study App: https://accuplacerpractice.collegeboard.org/login or Download the practice booklet: Go to https://accuplacer.collegeboard.org/student/practice and select Texas Success Initiative Sample Questions
 - 4. <u>PLEASE NOTE:</u> Students may be exempt from taking the TSI based on SAT/ACT/PSAT or EOC scores. Submit a copy of scores no later than 1/15/19. Exemptions are as follows:
 - SAT: Verbal 480+. Math 530+
 - ACT: 19+ on all sub scores with a composite of 23+
 - PSAT: Verbal 460+, Math 510+
 - EOCs: English III 4000+, Algebra II 4000+







Logging into ACES

1. Return to https://alamoaces.alamo.edu and enter your ACES User ID.



- 2. The initial default password will be the first 2 characters of your last name, in upper case followed by month (2 digits), day (2 digits), and year of your birthday (2 digits). For example, my name is Joe Smith and my birthday is January 2, 1966. My initial password would be SM010266.
- 3. After the default password information is submitted, the system will ask you to change your password. When you change your default password, you will be asked to provide Secret Questions and Answers.

Note: For security purposes, a list of Password Rules and constraints for the Secret Questions and answers is displayed.

Note: If you forget your password, the secret challenge questions will be asked in order to identify you. The answer must be an exact match to the answer you initially provided for the system to identify you.


- Will be authorized to retrieve, request, and share the student's High School (herein called School) records (to include a copy of the parent residency cards if necessary), transcripts, test scores and grades to determine eligibility. Information will be shared from School to College and/or College to School via email, fax or an electronic file.
- 2. Will comply with the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) (20 U.S.C. § 1232g; 34 CFR Part 99). All information provided to Alamo Colleges District relating to educational records will be confidential and Alamo Colleges District will not disclose, communicate or divulge, or permit disclosure, communication or divulgence, to another or use for their own benefit or the benefit of another, any confidential information, unless permitted by FERPA or required by the laws of the State of Texas.
- 3. Will not permit the student to participate in the School Program if he/she fails to: submit an accurate online application through AlamoENROLL by the announced deadline, submit all other documents pertaining to residency to the appropriate person by the announced deadline(s), verify enrollment into the correct dual credit courses, and/or maintain satisfactory academic progress.
- 4. Will provide a disabled student accommodation of his/her disability to participate in the program and activities of the Alamo Colleges District upon request. Accommodations are considered for approval when students are testing and/or taking courses on the College site. Support services may include special testing arrangements, readers, scribes, and note-taking services. However, Alamo Colleges District is neither able nor required to provide the level of disability support services offered through the School. For a student to receive disability support services at the College, the School student must provide a copy of the student's current IEP plan to the College's Disability Support Services ("DSS") office.
- 5. Will provide final eligibility status to the School dual credit liaison to complete the student's file.
- 6. Instructor will inform the student of academic progress/grade status at the third week and at mid-semester.
- 7. Will send all communication to the student's provided @student.alamo.edu email address accessible in ACES.

I understand that:

- 1. This form is valid for the duration of the student's participation in the School Program.
- 2. Submitting this consent form and/or School course card does not guarantee eligibility or enrollment into the program or selected courses. Eligibility and enrollment into the School Programs and courses is dependent on a complete application packet submitted by the deadline and qualifying test scores for each course selected, as determined by the servicing College and School.
- Courses will be more academically challenging than traditional School courses, will include different requirements and a separate grade for each course.

- 4. Courses held on the College campus (all instructional methods apply) may contain a mix of both School and traditional college students. Therefore, the subject matter of the course may be more complex and mature in nature and the expectation is that the student's behavior and performance will be equivalent to that of a college student.
- 5. My child may be enrolled in dual credit courses approved by the School.
- 6. Grades are awarded on a 4.0 scale at the College, and the School will convert them to the School letter grades according to its procedures.
- 7. Grades earned in dual credit courses are based off the instructor's evaluation of the student's progress, the College grade may be different than School grade, will become part of the student's permanent academic record, and will be reflected on the College transcript.
- 8. A student has a maximum of one (1) year from the end of the semester or term in which the final grade was issued to request a review of the grade or petition for a change of grade.
- 9. Students who fail to verify enrollment in ACES, per each term's Census Date for the College, cannot contest enrollment thereafter. The submission of a School transcript will not be considered.
- 10. Students must attend their dual credit class regularly and turn in all required assignments. Students may be withdrawn for lack of attendance and/or lack of progress. This attendance policy pertains to all students enrolled in any section of a dual credit course on any campus. If for any reason my child is not attending the dual credit class at the School regularly, he/she will be withdrawn from the class (includes students sent to alternative school and homebound students).
- 11. Students underperforming are encouraged to withdraw the course before the Last Date to Withdraw deadline, after conferring with a counselor. If student remains in course after the Last Date to Withdraw, they will be awarded the grade earned.
- 12. Students are responsible for knowing and adhering to the Last Date to Withdraw deadlines for withdrawal on the Alamo Colleges



- 13. Students are expected to meet academic standing as defined in the College catalog to continue in any of the School Programs offered through the Alamo Colleges District.
- 14. Student struggling to maintain a passing grade will be provided with options for the student's successful completion or be advised by the instructor, School counselor, assigned School staff, or the College academic representative on consequences of withdrawing the dual credit course in order to minimize future problems related to admissions, financial aid, and scholarships.
- 15. If a student plagiarizes a paper, or colludes or cheats in any dual credit class, the student will be subject to the disciplinary policies and procedures of the College. In some instances, severe cases may result in failure of the course and suspension from the School Program. Any disciplinary action will become part of the student's education record with the College district.
- 16. Courses are generally transferrable; however, it is not the College's responsibility to ensure that the dual credit course(s) for which the student enrolls are transferable to the College/university the student plans to attend.
- 17. If my child earns thirty or more college credits, he/she may be considered a sophomore at some universities and this could affect scholarships and other financial opportunities. It is my responsibility to check with the receiving institution to determine how dual credit hours are handled.
- 18. The School Program is now available for students in grades 9-12, as dual credit courses are available at your School.
- 19. Students who choose to take regular college courses outside the School Program requirements will be admitted as Early Admit and responsible to meet all admission requirements for the program as well as pay full tuition and fees based off residency status for all courses. Any college credit earned is strictly college credit and is part of any School Program agreement. Please work with the College's Admission Office for the admission process and deadlines.
- 20. Excluding Early College School, all students enrolled in School Programs <u>may not exceed a total of 14 courses throughout their time in School</u>.
- 21. Students may participate in one or more School Program (Dual Credit and Alamo Academies or Early College School and Alamo Academies) provided that they <u>do not exceed a total of 14 courses throughout their time in School</u>. Students pursuing this option will require special Academic Advising in order to ensure completion in at least one School Program.
- 22. Alamo Colleges District and the Colleges are not charging students tuition and fees, special program charges, textbook or instructional materials charges during their participation in any School Program. All associated cost will be waived and/or billed to the ISD/school per the adopted cost sharing model indicated in each ISD/Private/Charter school Memorandum of Understanding (MOU). 


